

OPEN FAST PATH IP POLICY

Adopted 30 November 2015

The idea behind *OpenFastPath* is to develop an open source licensed IP/TCP Stack. This IP Policy will reflect to this goal.

This Open Fast Path IP Policy describes the licensing model used by the OpenFastPath Foundation with the contributors and the recipients of the OpenFastPath software and materials, but nothing in this policy is intended to change or amend the exact terms and conditions of the OpenFastPath Contribution License Agreement (“Contribution Agreement”) which shall be concluded between each contributor and the OpenFastPath Foundation.

The licensing structure in OpenFastPath is designed to enable contributions from the contributors to OpenFastPath and the licensing of such contributions to the recipients, all in a manner that will enable widespread adaption and use of the OpenFastPath by companies and individuals.

Unless otherwise approved by the Board, all code contributions to the OpenFastPath shall be made under the Contribution Agreement available at openfastpath.org. Anyone wishing to contribute must prior to submitting any contribution sign and deliver the Contribution Agreement to the OpenFastPath Foundation. You may do it here openfastpath.org.

As enabled by the Contribution Agreement, the OpenFastPath Foundation will relicense copyright rights in the contributions under the familiar BSD copyright license, text available at openfastpath.org. The OpenFastPath Foundation will use (in source code file headers and/or notices file) copyright notice in form of “Copyright OpenFastPath Foundation and Contributors”. In addition, a list of all contributors will be included with the source code delivery.

As set forth in the Contribution Agreement each contributor grants a limited patent license (as defined in the Contribution Agreement) directly to the recipients of OpenFastPath software. In addition, the Contribution Agreement provides that if any entity institutes patent litigation against you, such patent licenses (as defined in the Contribution Agreement) granted to that entity will be terminated in accordance with Section 3 of the Contribution Agreement.

This IP Policy will not grant or imply any right or license to any intellectual property of any member of OpenFastPath Foundation or the OpenFastPath Foundation except as expressly set forth in the Contribution Agreement concluded between each contributor and the OpenFastPath Foundation referred to herein.

If you wish to use OpenFastPath trademark, please contact us via openfastpath.org. Let us know how you are planning on using the trademark and the Board may approve on a case by case basis your use of OpenFastPath trademark in accordance with trademark usage guidelines of the OpenFastPath Foundation.

The Board may amend this IP Policy as provided in the Bylaws of the OpenFastPath Foundation.
